Foster Father of Jesus**

Saint Joseph was chosen by God to be Jesus' father here on earth. God knew that Jesus would need a foster father to raise him and teach him. Scripture tells us that Joseph was a 'just man,' meaning he was a good man, honest, fair, and God-loving. Joseph was the husband of Mary



and protector of the Child Jesus as He grew. In Joseph's faithful, loving care was entrusted the childhood and youth of the Redeemer of the world. After the Mother of God herself, no one has ever been so blessed with virtues as Saint Joseph. Because he was the representative of our Heavenly Father on earth, because he acted as Christ's father in His life on earth, he is the divinely appointed head of the Holy Family. He is the 'patron saint of fathers.' Saint Joseph is invoked as a protector of the family. As a saint in Heaven he still acts as a husband and father to his family and the Church, and will intercede for us on many occasions. In 1870 Pope Pius IX declared him patron of the Universal Church.

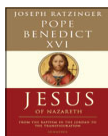

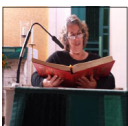
SOUL - OLMC WOMEN'S GROUP

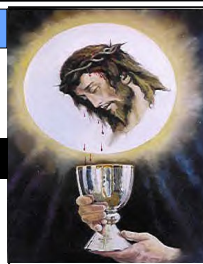
JOIN THE OLMC LECTOR MINISTRY

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Today's Solemn feast is also known as **Corpus Christi**, which translates from Latin to "**Body of Christ**."

This Feast originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the Universal Church by **Pope Urban IV in 1264**. It was traditionally celebrated on the **Thursday following Trinity Sunday**, and is one of the ten Holydays of Obligation in the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church. However in many countries today, as in the USA, it is observed **on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday**.

This celebration calls us to focus on **two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church**.

The **primary purpose** of this solemnity is to **focus our attention on the Eucharist**. At every Mass our attention is called to the **Eucharist** and the **Real Presence of Jesus Christ** in it.

The secondary focus is upon the **Body of Christ** as it is **present in the Church**. The Church is called **the Body of Christ** because of the *intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples*. He expresses this in the gospels by **using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head**. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.

At the request of Pope Urban IV, in celebration of this feast, **Saint Thomas Aquinas** composed the official prayers of the Church for this feast and two hymns most commonly associated with the Eucharist and Eucharistic adoration: "**Pange Lingua Gloriosi**" and "**Tantum Ergo Sacramentum**."
