**SAINT JUNIPERO SERRA**  
Feast day: July 1

A statue of Father Junipero Serra,

Miguel Jose Serra was born on the island of Majorca, November 24, 1713, and took the name of Junipero in 1730 when he entered the Franciscan Order. Ordained in 1737, he taught at the University of Padua. At the age of 37, he landed in Mexico City, and spent the rest of his life working for the conversion of the peoples of the New World. In 1768, Father Serra took over the Jesuit missions, following their

expulsion in the Province of Las Californias. An indefatigable worker, Father Serra was in large part responsible for the foundation and spread of the Church on the West Coast. He founded nine of 21 Spanish missions from San Diego to San Francisco and converted thousands of Indians, who were also taught sound methods of agriculture, cattle raising, and arts and crafts. He was imbued with a penitential spirit and practiced austerity in many of his activities. Worn out by his apostolic labors, he died August 28, 1784. Beatified by Pope John Paul II on September 25, 1988, Pope Francis canonized him September 23, 2015. Because of his piety combined with his missionary efforts, he was granted the posthumous title *Apostle of California*. His statue, representing the state of California, is in National Statuary Hall.

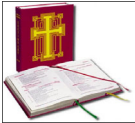

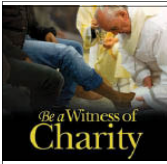

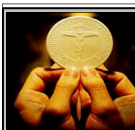


**DAILY MASS AND ROSARY DEVOTION**

# JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

**God, who is merciful, desires our mercy!**

Here are 10 ways to keep to mercy during this Jubilee Year. We'll add another 10 in another Bulletin when space is available. Try selecting one each week and putting it into practice.

- 1) Resist sarcasm; it is the antithesis of mercy: "Set, O Lord, a guard over my mouth; keep watch, O Lord, at the door of my lips!"
- 2) Pare down possessions: share your things with the needy.
- 3) Call someone who you know is lonely, even if you understand *why* they're lonely. *Especially* if you do.
- 4) Write a letter of forgiveness to someone. If you cannot send it, sprinkle it with holy water, ask Christ Jesus to have mercy on you both and then burn or bury it.
- 5) Learn to say this prayer: "Dear Lord, bless [annoying person's name] and have mercy on me!"
- 6) Plan a mini pilgrimage to a local shrine; make an effort along the way to live the corporal work of mercy of "welcoming the stranger" as Christ.
- 7) Do something kind and helpful for someone who you don't get along with, or who has wronged you.
- 8) Be mindful of your behavior online. Is that post designed to improve your image ... and leave others feeling bad? Are you hammering people in order to serve your anger and humiliate others?
- 9) Have Masses said for the living: friends and family members, even strangers you read/hear about, who are having a hard time.
- 10) Be generous enough to allow someone to help you; people need to feel needed.

## OLMC PARKING LOT NOTICE:

Please help us by observing the following:

- Do not park at anytime in the FIRE LANE
- Do not park in the two Clergy Spaces
- Do not park in the aisles until all *regular spaces* in the lot are filled -- that especially means -- do not park early in the aisles and block the exits.
