Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) June 3, 2018

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of *Corpus Christi*, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ." This solemn feast originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the Universal Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. It was traditionally celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday, however in many countries today, as in the USA, it is observed on the Sunday following. This celebration calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and



the Church. The primary purpose of this solemnity is to focus our attention on the Eucharist the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. The secondary focus is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. At the request of Pope Urban IV to a Dominican priest, in celebration of this feast, St. Thomas Aquinas, O.P., composed two hymns most commonly associated with the Eucharist and Benediction: *Pange Lingua* ("Tantum Ergo Sacramentum.") and *O Salutaris Hostia*.

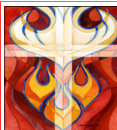


(RCIA) HAVE YOU EVER CONSIDERED BECOMING A FULL MEMBER OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH...
