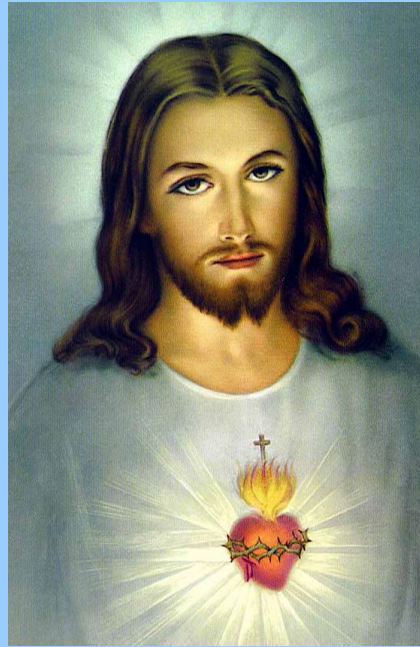

Devotion to the
Sacred Heart of Jesus
Solemnity observed
June 8, 2018

The Feast of the Sacred Heart is one of the most popular in the Catholic Church. Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the 11th century, but through the 16th century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to devotion to the Five Wounds of Jesus. The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated in Rennes, France. From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal. In all of the visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the



Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. The "great apparition," which took place in June, 1675, is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast be celebrated in the week following the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men and women for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them. The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind. The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France. Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, extended the feast to the universal Church to the 19th day after Pentecost.

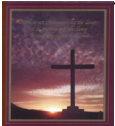

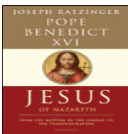
DAILY MASS AND ROSARY DEVOTION A Great Summer Exercise...





3 Ways Many Catholics Are Receiving the Eucharist Wrong

- 1) Not bowing before receiving**
 When receiving Holy Communion, the communicant bows his or her head before the Sacrament as a gesture of reverence before receiving Jesus... [T]he sign of reverence is also made before receiving the Precious Blood.
- 2) Not saying "Amen"**
 This is important because it confirms that you really do believe that you are receiving Christ Himself.
- 3) Are you in a state of grace?**
 It's impossible to know the state of people's souls. But it's not clear most Catholics really understand this: you are only supposed to receive the Eucharist if you are a **practicing Catholic** in a **state of grace**. Have you committed any mortal sins since you last went to confession? If the answer is yes, then you need to go to confession before receiving the Eucharist. You should still attend Mass, but if you aren't in a state of grace, you shouldn't receive.
