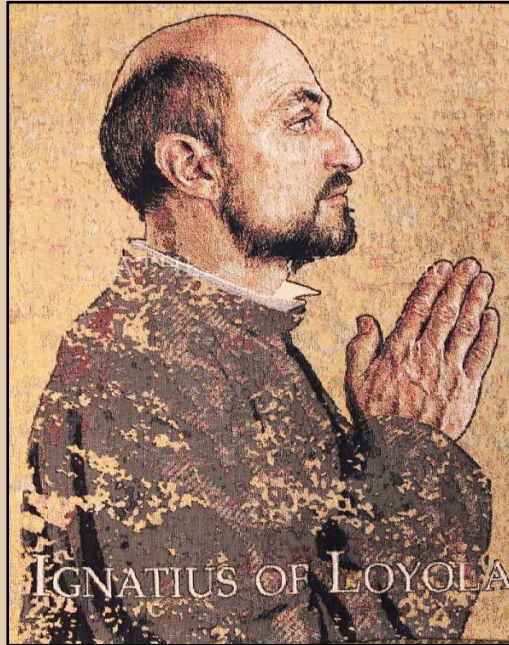

St. Ignatius Loyola
Founder of the Jesuits
Feastday: July 31

St. Ignatius of Loyola was a Spanish knight from a local Basque noble family, hermit, priest since 1537, and theologian, who founded the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Ignatius emerged as a religious leader during the Counter-Reformation. Loyola's devotion to the Catholic Church was characterized by absolute obedience to the Pope. He was born in the family castle in Guipúzcoa, Spain, the youngest of 13 children. When he was old enough, he became a soldier of Spain to fight against the French.



A cannon ball and series of bad operations ended his military career. While in recovery, he read the lives of the saints, and decided to dedicate himself to becoming a "soldier of the Catholic Faith." Soon after he experienced a series of visions which led him to develop his famous "Spiritual Exercises." Ignatius finished his studies at the University of Paris at the age of 43. His humble lifestyle attracted several followers at the university, including St. Francis Xavier, with whom he started the Jesuit order. There are 38 members of the Society of Jesus who have been declared Blessed, and 38 who have been canonized as saints.

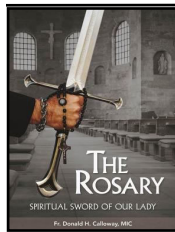

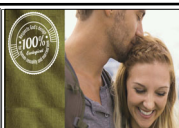
