SAINT JOHN PAUL II
Feast day: October 22

Saint Pope John Paul II was born Karol Wojtyla in 1920, in Wadowice, Poland. He was ordained a priest in 1946, became the archbishop of Krakow in 1964, and took part in the Second Vatican Council (1963-1965). He was made a cardinal by Pope Paul VI in 1967, and in 1978 became the first non-Italian pope in more than 400 years.



His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people, and the sick, led him to make numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. He was a vocal advocate for human rights and is credited with the fall of communism in his native Poland. He often spoke out about suffering in the world. He left as a heritage to the Church a rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, and the revised Code of Canon Law. He died on April 2, 2005, at the age of 84. Three million people attended his Funeral. He was canonized by Pope Francis on April 27, 2014.

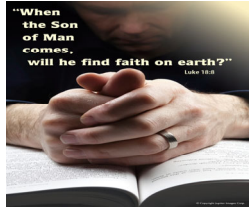

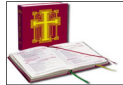

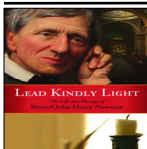
