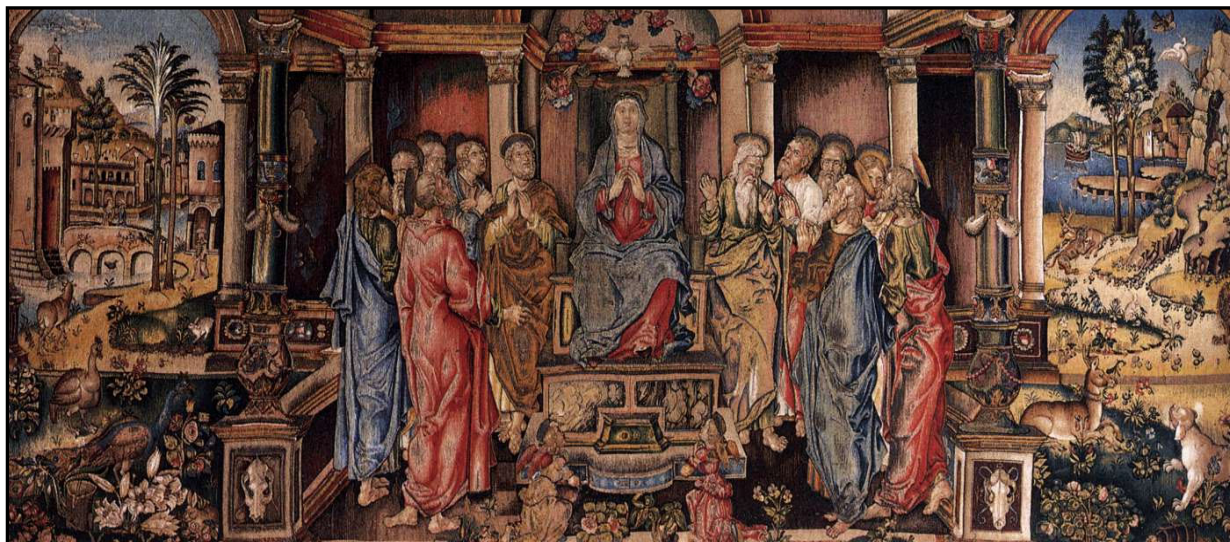

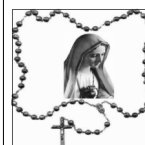
*"Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist,
