




This is the place to do your Christmas shopping. Friends are welcome. Payment is by cash or check only. Proceeds will support local Catholic schools. See you there!

**Eucharistic Adoration**

The fourth day of every month unless the fourth day falls on Sunday or a national holiday.

**Sacrament of the Sick**

In the event of a serious illness or a medical emergency, Monsignor Baird should be contacted immediately so that the Sacraments of the Church may be celebrated.

**Funerals**

At the death of a loved one, please notify Monsignor Baird so that a date and time for the Funeral Liturgy may be arranged.

**Sacrament of Matrimony**

Registration and preparation are required. Please contact the parish office six months in advance of desired wedding date. At least one member of the engaged couple must be a practicing Catholic and a member of the Chapel at least one year prior to the wedding date.

**Baptisms**

Baptisms are *usually* scheduled for the first Sunday of every month. Sacramental preparation is requested for parents and Godparents. A Godparent must be a practicing and confirmed Catholic and, if married, married in the Church.
