NEXT SUNDAY IS THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT
The Meaning of the Advent Wreath

The circular wreath represents the fact that God has no beginning and no end. The evergreen branches stand for everlasting life.

Four candles, representing Christ as the light of the world, adorn the wreath. Traditionally, three of the candles are purple, a sign of penance. These candles are lit on the first, second and fourth weeks of Advent. On the third week, known as Gaudete ("Rejoice") Sunday, a rose candle is lit which symbolizes joy as the half-way mark through Advent is reached in preparation for Christmas.

The following blessing might be prayed daily:

"O God, by whose word all things are sanctified, pour forth your blessing upon this wreath and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the Coming of Christ, and may receive from You abundant graces.

Through Christ Our Lord, Amen."
